
1) What are the main concerns and risks?


Reporting Concerns Process



The flowchart is to help you decide your next steps; is it something that you can deal with at your centre/club or does it need referring onto the Police, your Local Authority (England, Wales & Northern Ireland only), your Safeguarding Lead Officer, or the BHS.

If you are unsure on whether it is something you can deal with yourself or if it does need referring on, then please get in touch with your Club or Centre Safeguarding Officer or your Member Body Safeguarding Officer or the BEF Safeguarding team. All are here to help you and give further advice and information.

Reporting a concern



Confidentiality

All safeguarding concerns should be dealt with sensitively and promptly.

Information should only be shared with:

- Police
- Social Care/LADO
- Member Body Safeguarding Officer
- BEF Safeguarding Officer

Remember: Information should NOT be discussed in open forums. Await further guidance/instructions from one of the above organisations.

Barriers to Disclosure

- The Child's fear of not being believed
- They may not have thought what they experienced was abuse
- They may worry that they will get into trouble

In sport it may be because:

- They are worried they won't get selected
- They won't be believed because of the power and influence a coach has on everyone around him/her
- They don't know who or how to tell
- They Fear of the rest of the riders will turn against them
- Adult not actually hearing or seeing attempts by a child to disclose
- Adults own personal values and beliefs
- The accused might be known to them
- Disbelief
- Lack of training
- Not wanting to get involved
