2023 Training Dates

We have a bumper crop of training opportunities for you over the next quarter:

- <u>Social Media Marketing Essential</u>: Specially designed for volunteers who contribute to social media, covering good practice, content generation, sign-off process for photos and images and available resources.
- <u>GDPR and what it means for you</u>: Everything a volunteer needs to know with real life volunteer examples.
- <u>BHS Events What You Need to Know</u>: This training covers both online and in-person events, from how to make the most of presenters and venues, dodge the pitfalls of online booking and social media, as well as hints and tips to maximise your success.
- <u>Introduction to BHS Volunteering</u>: An online induction or refresher including an overview of the Society and will answer some common volunteer questions, including expenses, training and GDPR. Available to all volunteers.
- Access training is a great way of learning all about the law and issues around your rights to ride and carriage drive. These are free to attend for volunteers, if you are interested in attending one of these sessions, please contact molly.bannister@bhs.org.uk. We offer three levels of training:
 - Level One is an introduction to highway law in England and Wales. Available dates:
 - Sunday 8 January
 - Sunday 19 February
 - Sunday 26 March
 - Level Two builds on the foundation Level One, covering changes to rights of way and evidence of unrecorded bridleways and byways in England and Wales. Available dates:
 - Sunday 29 January
 - Level Three considers more advanced law and its application in more complex situations. It also looks further at user evidence and modification order applications.
 Available dates:
 - Sunday 5 March
