The BHS is only able to make changes to passports originally issued by the Society. We cannot process any passport issued by another organisation.

This form allows a Veterinary Surgeon to confirm an equine with a British Horse Society passport has been castrated or had a microchip implanted. This form must be completed by a Veterinary Surgeon and returned with the BHS passport to the address at the bottom of this form. Scanned forms can be emailed to the address at the bottom of this form, but they must be in full colour and of good quality. Please note that if you are not the current registered owner of the equine, a Change of Ownership Form must accompany this application.

The BHS will complete the required changes within 15 working days and return the passport by 2nd Class Signed ForTM. There is no charge for this service. If you require our Fast Track service, so the changes are made in one working day, please call our Passport Office to pay an additional £25 over the phone.
