

Eventing disciplines

This sign off is to be used to record formal training towards your BHS assessment. Training is compulsory and this form is required to be completed as part of your Recognition of Prior Experiential Learning (RPEL) direct entry application and before you apply for your assessment. It must be completed by:

- A BHS Assessor who assesses at the level, OR,
- A Performance Coach (BHSI) or Fellow (FBHS) within a BHS Approved BHSI Training Centre.

Your RPEL application will include:

- This completed document
- CV (detailing work history (including experiential learning) and competition record.
 - For the riding units you must evidence that you have produced a minimum of two horses from being untrained to successful completion at 3* level (to have completed six 3* events gaining M.E.R for 4* on at least two occasions)
 - For the coaching units you must evidence that you regularly coach riders at all levels in all eventing disciplines from novice up to 3* level

Completion of this document does not mean that you will necessarily be successful in passing the assessment on the day.
